The B'nai Israel Men's Club and Sisterhood are pleased to present Mr. Marvin Kalb on Sunday morning, March 18. Breakfast will begin at 10:00 a.m. with Mr. Kalb's presentation beginning at 10:30 a.m.

Marvin Kalb was born June 9, 1930. He is a journalist and senior advisor to the Pulitzer Center on Crisis Reporting. He is the founding director of the Shorenstein Center on Media, Politics and Public Policy at Harvard University where he is also the Edward R. Murrow Professor emeritus.

Mr. Kalb is also a senior fellow, foreign affairs, at the Brookings Institution. He hosts *The Kalb Report*, a monthly discussion of media ethics and responsibility at the National Press Club. He is also a recipient of the Fourth Estate Award, the National Press Club's highest honor.

Mr. Kalb spent 30 years as an award-winning reporter for CBS News and NBC News. Kalb was the last newsman recruited by Edward R. Murrow to join CBS News, becoming part of the later generation of the "Murrow Boys." While at CBS, Mr. Kalb was Moscow correspondent and diplomatic correspondent. At NBC, he served as chief diplomatic correspondent and host of *Meet the Press*.

Mr. Kalb is the author of 15 books including *Eastern Exposure*, *Dragon in the Kremlin*, *The Volga*, *Roots of Involvement*, *Kissinger*, *Campaign '88*, *The Nixon Memo*, *One Scandalous Story*, *In the National Interest*, and *The Last Ambassador*. He is finishing his 16th book on Trump and the media.

His new book, *The Year I was Peter the Great*, was published on October 10, 2017, and is a memoir of one especially interesting year: 1956. Mr. Kalb will be talking about his new book as well as offering some of his insights into the challenges facing the media today. This new book will be available for sale following the Mr. Kalb's presentation.
